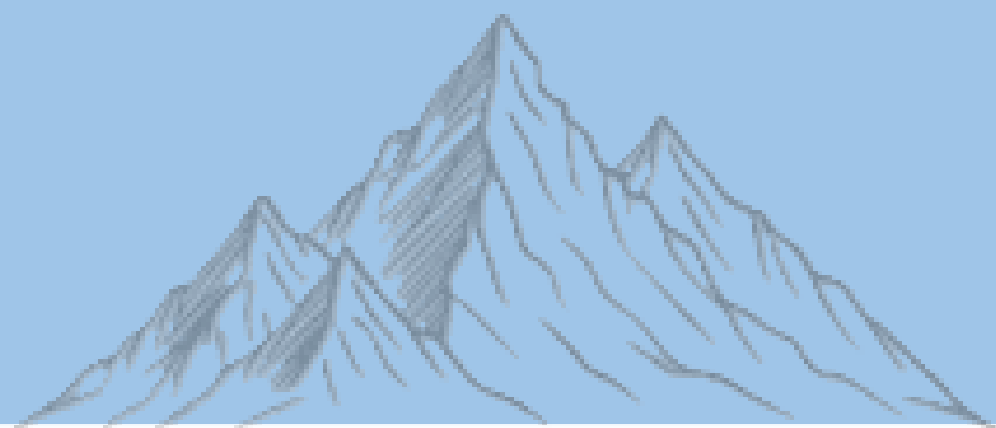

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Welcome

Welcome to the Above & Beyond Programme, which provides a wide range of exciting extra-curricular opportunities for all students across the school. The staff at Ruislip High School have worked together to produce a timetable of clubs and societies that aim to provide students with the opportunity to supplement their academic endeavours, as well as their physical fitness and stamina.

Please read through this booklet to find out the options for our enrichment clubs on offer this term. **We recommend that students in Key Stage 3 aim to attend at least two clubs per week and students in Key Stage 4 and 5 aim to attend at least one club per week.** If students wish to attend clubs that fall on the same day, they may alternate each week.

Some activities require a termly payment to cover the running costs of the activity. Any costs are listed next to the information about the club within this booklet. If a student wishes to attend a club with a cost, parents will be contacted to make payment via ParentPay by the **deadline of Sunday 7th of September 2025. Delayed payments may lead to places being offered to other students.** Paid clubs are non-refundable except for cases with extenuating circumstances.

The deadline to register for clubs is **Monday 1st September 2025**. THE ABOVE & BEYOND AWARD

The purpose of the award is to recognise the students who take up all opportunities in school to enrich their wider understanding of the world and have a passion for learning beyond the classroom.

A range of enriching experiences, opportunities and all of our Above & Beyond clubs have been included in one of the following four categories: community, physical, creativity and culture.

Each category has bronze, silver and gold criteria. When students meet the criteria under each category, they will earn a bronze, silver or gold award for the category.

Therefore, a student could hold a bronze award for physical or a silver award for creativity. If students meet the criteria at a particular level across all four categories, then they will qualify for an overall 'Above and Beyond Award' at that level.

The criteria has been developed to allow students to progress across the levels over their time at Ruislip High School.

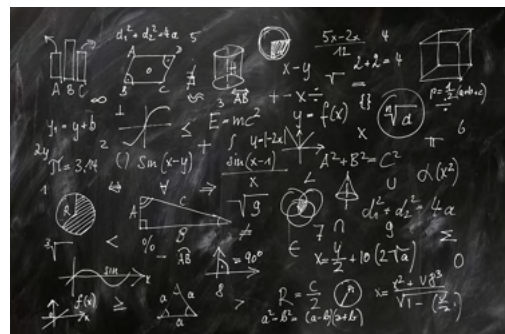

At Maths Club students can receive one-to-one support on topics they find challenging, help with homework and extension work.

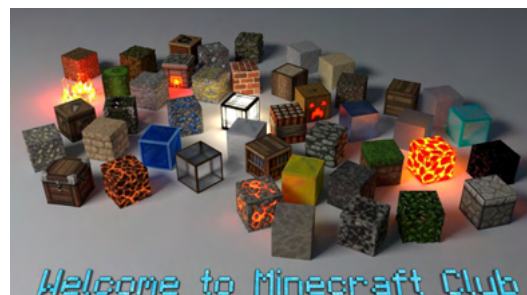
The Maths Club is run as a way to inspire a love of maths so that learners can become confident and resilient problem solvers.
