1C Tudor England 1485-1603 Summer Work

1. Your first task will be to research the History of America. Who were the first western people to arrive and how they were treated: the Native People, African Slaves they brought over and why they became an independent country in 1776. (30 Mins)
2. The next stage of your research will involve you watching a video on the often unheard history of the Native Americans. This will give you an overview of what problems the Native American people faced after European colonisation.
