

Making choices

Consider:

- What do you enjoy?
- Have you looked at the course information in the options booklet?
- Have you spoken to staff and student leaders?
- How much coursework/practical assessment is there
 and does this play to your strengths?
- Will it combine well with other subjects?
- What do you need to come to RHS Sixth Form?
- Have you picked a range of subjects to make sure you have kept your future options open?

Don't:

- Choose a subject because your friend is;
- Choose a subject that's new without finding out about it;
- Choose subjects because you think they are 'easy' or an opportunity to unwind/relax;
- Choose subjects that are unsuited to your natural skillset (Drama/Art/Music);
- Choose a subject because you think a particular teacher will or won't be teaching it.
