A message from Mr Davies:

I'd like to start this week by thanking those parents/guardians who have taken the time to write to express their congratulations to school staff following the publication of our Ofsted report last week. Although we are delighted that the inspectors recognised the calm, purposeful environment and community ethos that pervades our community, it has been very much business as usual at the school this week.

On Tuesday I attended our Year 12 post-18 options evening in which Ms O'Neill and Mr Peacock delivered presentations on how we support students through the university and apprenticeship routes that are open to them. Listening to the depth of their knowledge on Thursday it is no surprise that we have so many students attending the most prestigious universities in the country and taking up apprenticeships with multinational companies such as Sky, KPMG and L'Oreal.

Wednesday was also an action-packed day at the school as we hosted the annual Vanguard Learning Trust spelling bee. Students from RHS came a creditable second in what was an outstanding collaborative event and the way our RHS audience supported students from all our Trust partner schools was respectful and helped make the event a real success. A more detailed article is included below. Wednesday also saw the second showing of the 'Little Women' performance that was such a hit before Christmas. I would like to thank everyone who supported the production which was every bit as good as the first night.

Our week of evening events continued on Thursday when our partners from Uxbridge College delivered a talk to our Year 11 students interested in more vocational routes than the school is able to provide in our Sixth Form. I was delighted to hear this week that we have had a record number of internal applications to our Sixth Form next year, but I do recognise that for a minority of students Sixth Form study at RHS is not for them; in those instances what we do at the school is ensure that we provide the appropriate support and guidance to ensure our students transition to the right course and institution to allow them to flourish in post-16 education.

Buzz at the VLT Spelling Bee

On Wednesday 24th January, 2024, Ruislip High School was excited to host the Vanguard Learning Trust's spelling bee for the second year in a row. We were also really pleased to welcome the staff and students from Oak Farm Junior School, for their first experience of the spelling bee.

The room was filled with anticipatory buzz even before the competition began. Students across all six schools, alongside Ruislip High's Year 7 cohort, filled the seats of the theatre - all in support of their peers.

Once the competition began, representatives from each school took turns spelling increasingly challenging words, one-by-one, earning points for each correctly spelt word. As the difficulty of each word increased, so did the pressure, but the students rose to the challenge. RHS and Field End were neck and neck, but Field End held their nerve to take the first round.

The second round was the speed challenge. Words in this round centred around the themes of exploration. Students had a choice of difficulty: easy, medium, or hard words to spell. There were some clear tactics employed by the teams with a number of them choosing the 1-point easy ones to answer as quickly as possible.

At this stage, it was still anyone's game. The last round, though technically the individual challenge, was a final opportunity to earn a few additional points to change up the standings. However, with even more challenging words, the fight for the last speller standing was nail-biting. With just two students left standing, Mr Gould commented, "It's just like a penalty shootout!". Japji from Vyners ended up taking the crown of Trust Best Speller, but her fantastic effort in the final round wasn't enough to wrestle the overall lead from Field End, who deservedly claimed the team award.

Overall, it was a great opportunity to showcase the best of all six schools. Well done to all our top spellers across the trust, and congratulations to Field End's stellar Year 6 team on their phenomenal teamwork; it was a well-deserved win.

Due to this, there is an early finish for students.

Students in Years 10-11 will be dismissed at 1.25pm on Thursday 8th February 2023 and students in Years 7-9 will be dismissed at 1.35pm. The majority of Year 12 and Year 13 lessons will take place as usual during both period 5 and period 6: students will be told in class and through assembly, and notified via Google Classroom, where lessons are not able to take place due to the parents' evening.

Year 9 Young Green Briton Challenge:



On Friday 26th January, every student in Year 9 was given the chance to participate in the Young Green Briton Challenge. This exciting project is a national platform to nurture, support and celebrate youth-led, school-based climate action. The challenge uses an adapted design thinking curriculum to enable young people to design entrepreneurial solutions to local climate issues.

The full day 'Design Sprint', saw members of the Young Green Briton team hosting a series of workshops and activities to develop the students' green skills, teamwork and social action. Our Year 9 students got stuck in, working collaboratively to tackle a host of climate issues raised. All students enjoyed the chance to work together, be creative and attempt to find solutions to real world problems.

Dorentina, 9A, said: "Taking part in today's challenge has been really great. I have had a wonderful time planning with my team thinking about how to reduce our plastic usage. I think this is a chance for young people to share their ideas and for adults to listen to us - we have some good ideas!"
