Dear Parents/Guardians

I am writing today as we approach the end of what has been a long term and one where students have shown how much they embody our values, particularly perseverance and inspiration. Each and every day, our school community works incredibly hard to ensure students achieve their potential and the past few weeks have seen students in Years 10 and 11 undertake their pre-public examinations, while students in Year 13 have been preparing for their PPEs, which take place at the start of the new term. Staff have been impressed with the diligence students have shown towards assessments and with the excellent behaviour and attitudes to learning they have displayed.

I was also fortunate enough to attend last night's winter concert at the school, which showcased the incredible musical skills of our students. Our students performed a range of pieces from a wide variety of genres, and really demonstrated the strength of expressive arts in the school. I would like to thank Ms Nastou, Curriculum Leader for Music, as well as the performers and the parents and members of the community who attended and supported the event. Earlier in the evening, we also hosted our annual Sixth Form community event, which saw our Sixth Form students host a buffet and bingo for senior citizens from our local community. It was a delight to talk to these visitors, and I felt very proud all evening as we demonstrated once more that we truly are a school both in, and for, the community.

School procedures in the event of an unexpected closure

I am conscious that although the weather is currently unseasonably mild, we are approaching the time of year when inclement weather can bring our country to a standstill. I am also aware that certain other incidents and events can occur from time to time and although mercifully rare, I believe it is important that we have contingencies in place. In the event that the school needs to close unexpectedly for any reason, parents/guardians will be informed of any such decision via the Arbor app by 7:30am on the day of the closure. This information will also be published on the school's website. In making this decision, I will access all relevant information and consider likely health and safety issues. The school will always endeavour to move to a remote provision as quickly as possible and we will keep parents updated as we deal with any situation.

Catering

After February half-term, there will be a small increase in school meal prices. These changes follow a Trust-wide review of the catering budget, which has been impacted by rising food and staffing costs following a two-year price freeze. Trustees have approved a modest tariff increase and an updated daily spend cap of £6.50 to help maintain a high-quality and sustainable catering service. The update to the daily spend limit will be implemented from January 2026, ahead of the increases that will come into effect after the half term. The overall impact on average spend is expected to be low, and the Trust will continue to monitor pricing and meal uptake closely.

Attendance

As we approach the end of the Autumn term, I want to remind families how important it is for children to attend school every day. National research has shown that pupils who attend school regularly achieve much better results than those who miss lessons. Students in Year 11 who miss just 10 days of school in the year of their public exams have their chances of achieving a grade 5 in maths and English halved. Good attendance starts at home with simple, strong routines such as limiting screen time, going to bed on time, getting enough sleep and having a calm start to the morning. When children arrive on time and ready to learn, they are more confident and make better progress. Every day in school really does make a difference, and we appreciate your support in helping your child attend school every day.

Uniform

Many of our parents and members of the wider community often comment on how smart and presentable our students appear in their uniform. This is something we value greatly. I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and guardians of the importance of your continued support in upholding the school's standards, as agreed at the start of your child's journey at RHS through the Home-School Agreement.

One of our uniform rules states that students may wear only one small gold or silver stud in each earlobe. With the Christmas break approaching, we ask that you support the school by ensuring that no additional piercings are undertaken, as students will be asked to remove any non-compliant piercings when they return in January.

I would also like to highlight our expectations regarding make-up. Make-up is not permitted at RHS. This includes foundation, mascara, false eyelashes, eyebrow tinting, lipstick, false nails and any other cosmetic products. A Christmas Carol


