Dear Parents/Guardians

I would like to thank all parents/guardians for supporting the school in our drive to maintain our exceptionally high standards despite energy-sapping temperatures throughout the week. Given the high temperatures, it was clear that we had to make adjustments to our uniform and I am grateful to students for wearing the adjusted uniform as instructed and to parents/guardians for their continued support. As the weather looks set to remain very warm into next week, we will continue with the summer uniform and I will write separately to parents/guardians when we deem it appropriate to return to the full uniform. School staff have done as much as possible to keep the building cool this week, including ventilating the building during the cooler hours of the day where possible. I would like to remind parents/guardians that students should have a water bottle, which can be refilled during social times, and that should students choose to spend social time outside, they should bring and use sun cream.

I am happy to keep the agenda fairly open and we can discuss how to move the group forward into the next academic year.

Mobile phone usage

I wrote to the parents/guardians of our new Year 6 into 7 students earlier in the week, to outline a change in approach at the school regarding smartphones. I attach the letter <u>here</u>, and a frequently asked questions document <u>here</u>. I am conscious that although the use of mobile phones in school is not a significant issue at Ruislip High School, I believe there is an increasing body of evidence that suggests there are real dangers in providing access to social media to children. I am also increasingly concerned that our students are becoming targets for street crime given the expensive phones that they are carrying. We had particularly unpleasant incidents earlier in the week where our students were victims of this type of crime and I remain concerned regarding the number of our students who walk in the local area with their phones in their hands.

Message from the Metropolitan Police

As outlined in my comments about mobile phones above, it is clear that Hillingdon Borough has seen an increase in theft, snatch and robbery offences in the last couple of weeks. School-age children have been victims of some of these offences, with some of the incidents involving young people travelling to and from school. Mobile phones are primarily being targeted. I have received various information leaflets from the Metropolitan Police and other agencies this week, and I wanted to share these with parents/guardians. I will continue to work closely with the local police, and RHS staff will continue to patrol the area in the immediate vicinity of the school. Please find some useful links below:
