Forthcoming pre-public examinations (PPEs)

PPEs begin for students in Year 11 on Monday 4th December 2023 and students in Year 10 will also sit their PPE in Citizenship on Wednesday 13th December 2023, with Year 13 students sitting PPEs next term. I know students are working hard to prepare for the PPEs and this morning I spoke to Year 11 in assembly and asked Mr Karimi, Lead Practitioner and Teacher of Psychology, to remind students of the best ways they can prepare for their forthcoming examinations. I would like to remind parents and guardians that the PPEs serve to support students with practising the routine of public examinations and to identify the key areas teachers and students need to focus on before next summer. Last week saw our annual Sixth Form Open Evening and it was fantastic to see the overwhelming majority of our Year 11 students in attendance, as well as a significant number of students from other local schools. Google Classroom

All students have access to Google Classroom and parents/guardians should receive summaries of their child's work via email. Please email <u>office@ruisliphigh.org.uk</u> should you have any questions or concerns about Google Classroom. Students can contact their teachers to ask for advice or seek clarification via Google Classroom but parents/guardians should email <u>office@ruisliphigh.org.uk</u> marked for the attention of the teacher.

I would also like to remind parents/guardians that, should a student be absent from school because they are unwell, they should not contact their teacher on Google Classroom to ask for missed work. If students are too

















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unwell to attend school, they should focus on getting better and catch up on any missed work upon their return. In a case where a student is likely to be absent for an extended period, parents/guardians should contact the student's Head of Year.

Safeguarding

We take safeguarding incredibly seriously and, like other local schools, we use knife arches and drug detection dogs, in conjunction with the Metropolitan Police, as preventative measures and to remind students that the school needs to be free from weapons and illegal drugs. I would like to reassure parents and guardians that these are routine measures to ensure the safety of all of our community and thank you for your support with this.

Student Parliament

The undoubted highlight of my week has been the hour I spent this afternoon meeting with our Student Parliament. We reformed the structure of the Parliament this year with a larger group meeting with Mr Askin, Assistant Headteacher, in the first instance and then a smaller group meeting with me. We covered a number of issues from recycling to rewards, as well as an interesting discussion on cultural awareness and the environment. I found the student feedback invaluable and I am confident that we can implement a number of changes based on the important points that were raised. The Parliament also provides me and other school leaders with the opportunity to explain to students the rationale behind school policies on issues such as uniform and the behaviour policy.
