Dear Parents/Guardians

Re: Welcome to Year 9

I would like to take the opportunity to welcome you and your child back into Ruislip High School and Year 9 after what I hope was a lovely Summer. I know already that this is going to be an exciting year full of opportunities and I wanted to provide for you a place with key dates, expectations for the year and other important information.

Year 9 is a fundamental year in your child's education. This is the year when they will get to choose their GCSE options and work towards their successful future. My expectations for the year group this year are unchanged: all students try their best, even when facing challenges; respect each other and all members of staff at school; enjoy learning and taking on new opportunities beyond the classroom. The Year 9 team will be working closely with students to ensure that they settle into a good routine again, especially regarding punctuality and homework and enjoy their time with us. I will send a separate message regarding homework and the new set up for Study Club referrals.

To get the best out of every opportunity means that students need to be here to take them. Attendance is very important to us at Ruislip High School. Of course, if a student is genuinely too ill to be in school, we want them to stay at home to rest and recover. However, it is important to recognise that we may not feel our best all of the time but students should strive to have the self discipline and resilience to ensure that they are in school and learning. We expect students to have an attendance record of at least 97% across the year. If, for any reason, your child is unable to attend school, we ask that you send a message on Class Charts each day that they are absent so that we are able to authorise their absence. You will be contacted regularly by your child's Form Tutor to offer you support if their attendance falls under 90%.

Class Charts will be our main method of communicating with parents. This is where you will receive letters like this as well as key information about your child. With the Class Charts app you can see what rewards or sanctions your child has received during the day as well as their attendance percentage. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any issues with the app.

At Ruislip High School we like to reward students who embody the school values. We run two reward trips every year which students are always keen to go on. The criteria for the trips are: minimum 90% attendance (as we take covid into account), fewer than five warnings, and no higher level sanctions. I hope that Year 9 will have the highest number of students eligible for the reward trips again this year!

It is vital that families and Ruislip High School work together in partnership: we are always happy to work with you for the best of the student. Form Tutors or subject teachers are usually the first port of call if you have a question or a concern that you want to raise and I am also available to discuss any pastoral issues faced by your child.
